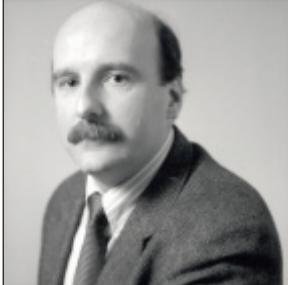


WILLIAM J. BOURQUE
